The evening moved on and a few more important awards were presented. The Events Planning Committee also presented long-time member Dru Dunwoody with an award. In addition, I presented


Crane and Ron with the Executive Director MVP award. I did this in recognition for all they have done over the years for the NGPA.

Those who oppose receiving the magazine unless it's wrapped have a different argument. They say that it is not their neighbor or mail person's business about the mail they are receiving.


Thankfully, there are a few options which can ultimately keep both sides satisfied.
