



HOW IS THE NGPA GOVERNED?

We feel as your leaders, and as our responsibility to the NGPA membership that we give you some insight on how our current process works in regards to the upcoming Board of Directors election process. While we are constantly evaluating our governing by-laws to ensure integrity and responsiveness to NGPA's needs, we are also constantly striving to make sure we have the correct people in place to properly lead and carefully guide the NGPA of tomorrow.

There are processes in place and guidelines designed specifically around ensuring a high degree of integrity exists within each of the board members elected to service. After on the board, there is ongoing oversight to make certain those actively on the board act ethically during the time they serve the NGPA. We have even recently gone back and reviewed the previously created code of ethics because with all things documents, it needed to be updated to be relevant to current and changing times.

As far as the actual structure of the NGPA board of directors, the board consists of fourteen board members, two of which are non-voting members (Executive Director and

Education Fund Board Chairman do not vote). The board votes the twelve voting members on on a staggered cycle. Each member serves a two-year term up to five terms. The voting cycle is staggered so the NGPA will not have a potential complete turn over during an election process. This has proven to provide stability and consistent leadership. Recently the NGPA board voted in favor of adopting board term limits to ensure the NGPA is always bringing in fresh leaders and ideas.

Every year, during a length of time, we

solicit our membership for statement of interests for those interested in joining the board. The governance committee, which consists of three voted on board of directors and up to two general members evaluate the candidates, and based on the current needs of the board, return to the board with their recommendations. The board then discusses the recommended candidates and then a vote takes place. The candidate is selected by a simple majority of board votes.

We are excited for this years round of elections as we are seeking talent within our own community. We have had several SOI's that have been submitted before the deadline that are currently under review. We will be announcing towards the end of the year after our annual board meeting in November, the newly elected board members. AMERICAN AIRLINES BOEING 737 NEXT GEN TYPE RATING SCHOLARSHIPS (6) JUST ADDED

"I am excited to see the airlines continue to expand their financial support to further education for aspiring aviators. The WAI conference recently announced American Airlines will be awarding 6 type ratings in their upcoming cycle. The NGPA continues to work with its airline partners and sponsors to provide more opportunities for young pilots to further their education. American airlines will award six B737 Next Gen type rating certificates to qualified members of Women in Aviation. The 13-day training program will be held at a facility located in the Dallas/Fort Worth area. Funds will be paid directly to the flight school and training must be completed within one year from the date of the award.

The training program includes manuals, cockpit panels and study guides, 48 hours of ground instruction, two hour FAA oral examination, 24 hours full flight simulator training (including four hours line oriented flight training [LOFT] and two hours FAA simulator checkride).


Minimum qualification includes the following: commercial, instrument, and multi engine certificates, a minimum of 1500 hours total flight time, must have passed an FAA ATP written within the last two years, and must hold a current first-class

FAA medical certificate.

In addition to the B737 Next Gen type rating scholarship, American airlines will host the recipient with attendance to the 2016 annual International Women in aviation conference in Nashville, Tennessee (including hotel, conference registration, air travel, and a daily allowance).

As well as the minimum WAI scholarship application requirements, candidates must address the following questions within their 500-word essay: How would this scholarship help you achieve your career goals? Why did you apply for the scholarship? What aviation activities/organizations have you been involved in?


